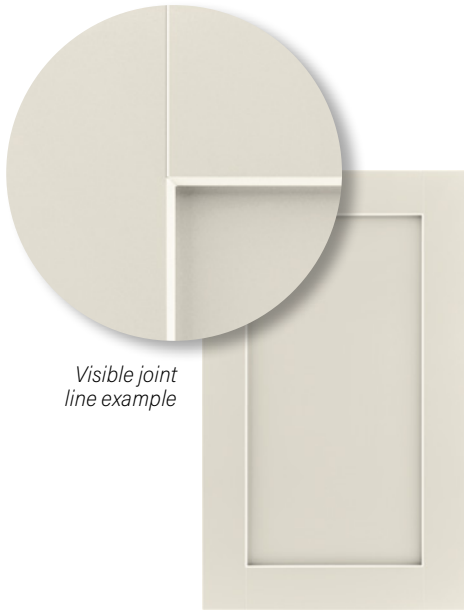

Painted Cabinetry: What to Expect

Our painted finishes are crafted from a combination of hardwoods and engineered materials, including solid wood, medium-density fiberboard (MDF), and high-density fiberboard (HDF). This combination provides superior stability, consistency, coverage, and durability, resulting in a smooth and consistent appearance with minimal visible wood grain. Painted door features include:

- Visible joint lines may appear due to the natural expansion and contraction of wood
- A natural aging process that may change the tone of paint colors over time

Environmental Factors: Due to natural and environmental factors, cabinetry added at a later date may not match the original cabinetry precisely. Factors that can affect the appearance include:

- Exposure to sunlight, smoke, and chemicals
- Changes in color or texture over time due to aging or environmental conditions

Glazed cabinetry features a painted base with an additional hand-whipped glaze that settles naturally into corners, grooves, and details, creating a unique, layered contrast.

The glazing effect is more prominent on lighter base colors, adding depth and dimension to the finish. On darker finishes, the glaze is subtler, providing a softer look. No two glazed cabinets are exactly alike, giving each piece a one-of-a-kind appearance that is a hallmark of glazed finishes.
